What is the Bermuda Health Council?

- Quasi-Autonomous Non-Governmental Organisation (QUANGO)
- Established by Bermuda Health Council Act 2004. Operational since 2006.
- Mission: To regulate, coordinate, and enhance the delivery of health services
- Activities are focused on health economics and regulation
- Policy Direction from Ministry of Health
- Structure:
 - Board 15 members
 - Secretariat 10 staff



Case Example

- Two employees initiated complaints
- Provided pay stubs showing deductions
- Health Council confirmed period of non-coverage
- Inspection of employee records
- Employee recouped over \$5,000 in unlawful deductions
- Health Council taking company to court



Role of the Compliance Officer

Monitor and enforce compliance with the Health Insurance Act 1970

Sources of Information:

- Insurer reports (monthly)
- Complaints
- Government Legislated Authorities

Actions:

- Notice of Non-Compliance letters
- Website List (www.bhec.bm/non-compliant/)
- Investigation
- Inspections
- Court





Incidence & Impact of Non-Compliance



Relevant Legislation

- Health Insurance Act 1970
 - Compulsory health insurance
 - Licensed insurer reporting to the Health Council
 - Deductions of no more than half premium amount
 - Employee obligations to inform employer regarding spouse
 - Recovery of damages during period of non-coverage
 - Duty of employer to provide information to employee



Relevant Legislation Continued

- Health Insurance (Inspection of Records) Regulations 2015
 - Power of Inspectors
 - Maintenance of records of employment and wages
 - Policy information for employees
 - Start and end dates of employment
 - Information on spouse
 - Wage deductions
 - Payments to insurer
- Health Insurance (Exemption) Regulations 1971
 - Less than 15 hours per week
 - Less than 2 months per year
 - Full-time student



Penalties for Non-Compliance

- Offences include:
 - No active health insurance policy
 - Unlawful deductions
 - Not informing employees
 - Failure to provide records
 - Theft or obtaining by deception
- Penalties include:
 - Fines
 - Imprisonment
