



What say to someone fighting cancer

At the age of 37, I was diagnosed with colon cancer. Since then, I have gone through many chemotherapy and radiation treatments, surgeries, CAT scans and blood tests. While receiving

therapy, I experienced devastating side effects and swallowed hundreds of pills. In the process, I very quickly learned that many people did not know how to relate to someone in my position.

This became especially apparent when I went public with my diagnosis. I had an announcement party two days before I flew to Boston for treatment. People then stopped me on the street and they all said the exact same two things and in the exact same order. "Oh, I'm so sorry to hear; my mother/sister/cousin/friend passed from cancer." Not once was that followed with any information about the person; maybe they were a great mother, cook, athlete or teacher?

Why does having had cancer have to overshadow everything else about a person who had it? Could cancer really erase people's legacy, and was I going to be next?

When you are speaking with a person who is fighting cancer, it is difficult to know their mental state. They could be stressed and depressed. Hearing about other people who passed from cancer is not helpful to them. A person with cancer may begin to think about giving up; if everyone knows someone who has passed from cancer, maybe the chances of surviving the illness are not high.

Hearing these comments made me stop and think if I had ever been guilty of saying the exact same things in the past. Having given the matter a great deal of thought, I was compelled to publish the book "Dear Cancer, Let Me Introduce Myself."

Do not let your words create fear; instead, infuse them with optimism, support and positivity. My advice to anyone who does not know what to say to someone with cancer, no matter their situation, is as follows. Be honest and say "I

may not know what you are going through, but I am so amazed by your strength and your will to get better." With that statement, you are not making the person with cancer feel the inevitability of death. Instead you are saying that you see the fighter in them, even if they may not feel like one at that moment. Do not let your words create fear; instead, infuse them with optimism, support and positivity.

Finally, follow up by offering support in a way you feel comfortable. Support is not merely giving flowers and saying kind words. Real support may include washing dishes, babysitting, taking out the trash, taking the dog for a walk, grocery shopping, giving rides to and from doctor appointments and treatments. Believe me, when a person feels unwell, it is hard for them to make everyday chores a priority. Their entire focus is just to have the strength to get through the day or night of side effects. The little things really do help.

Final thought: No matter what you are going through, you deserve to enjoy life. When you have the energy between surgeries and treatments, choose moments to reconnect, laugh and create new memories.


